

We believe that the lack of communication and absolute thinking are two of the main problems in our current world – and probably the world has always been like that--. The impossibility of communicating what we want to say. It would be great to clearly explain what we think or believe in a certain moment. Hesitating should be allowed. Sometimes, it seems that verbal, written and body language are not enough. Sometimes, codes, criteria, and intentions fail.

We find it too hard to make people understand what we feel. So, an idea to practice precisely that cropped up. And as we generally turn to our friends and family first when we are in need to communicate something, we believed that this experience had to take place among them (proportions are optional). The purpose is to exercise communication and to take a new road with yet unknown destination.

***Let's open our eyes in the Knowledge Journey.***

*Don't rely on the people who never say "I don't know".*

*We are almost sure that a little bit of hesitation ensures communication.*

*White and black create war. Gray, peace.*

*We believe that 10 simple and spontaneous sentences are more effective than a decorated long sentence when getting an idea across. A sentence even longer and more elaborate than this one.*

### **Starting point**

**If this letter is in your hands, you are already part of this project either because you are participating right now or because someone you know gave it to you personally or sent it by mail. If the latter is the case, it means that that person thinks you will probably enjoy this project and you will decide to carry it out. Probably that is what the person who gave you this did.**

**This letter is for those who don't know anything about these Sessions, and also for the rest –those who are participating or have already participated--, just because this document was the means to disseminate this idea.**

This proposal is meant to be carried out among your people and not to carry out statistics or social studies for corporations or government agencies. This project is not meant to cash out or build data bases, as is the case with e-mail chains. We are not members of any specific political party. We are far, far away from any new kind of religion or sect. Our only purpose is to start moving. To start reviving face-to-face communication. To recover conversation. To exercise our minds. This Project is not meant to be hidden, quite the contrary, in fact: it should be disseminated. If you keep reading, you will learn about details. This is an autonomous project. That means that each person receiving this letter can start putting into practice these activities without explaining

anything to anybody and can interrupt them when they please (as it should always be). It should take place among friends, family, etc. In this letter you will find just a set of simple recommendations and a few e-mail addresses so that all participants –(from different groups and geographical regions) have the chance to meet some time.

This Project was started some time ago, and as far as we know, it is going around in some European and South American countries. But what does “some time ago” mean? As this letter does not have an initial date beyond this version. When you read about the Project, you will realize that the date doesn’t matter. What does matter is the present time.

This idea came up among a group of acquaintances concerned about information exchange. With this project, nobody loses (at worst). At best, a network of people willing to teach and learn about an array of topics is built. Small discussion groups –“Roots,” as that’s the name they got-- in all cases are **NON PROFIT GROUPS**.

The idea is to go back to exchange information tête-à-tête. (traveler to traveler). This activity was cast aside by the speed of life and underestimated by an excess in (only a part of) the information that surrounds us. Communication seems to be fully covered by the almost endless internet offer and by all kinds of public opinion makers in newspapers, magazines, radio and TV programs. Are we being underestimated? Are we underestimating ourselves? It appears that we don’t need face-to-face interchange anymore.

Most of us know that it is needed and that we need it, and many others started to feel that but have not been able to verbalize it. The time has come to get together and talk. To discuss again. To think again.

This is addressed to all human beings, of all ages.

Each group will adapt this text to suit their needs.<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>1</sup> It can be said that due to the way this letter is written, many people are already being cast aside, because they don’t have the possibility to receive it or put this project into practice. For the time being, we take responsibility for this limitation and for not being able to find a short term solution. We are still aware of that and we will continue to think about it every day.

## The Project

### Objectives

To share information that is not necessarily applicable to everyday life, in a comfortable and prejudice free environment. Present you with specific topics that you have always wanted to know about, to which you have never had access. Present you with specific topics that you have never imagined to exist and could grow interesting. To travel through other people's knowledge.

For other people to travel through ours.

To create a new environment to know the people around us from another point of view. Provide new airs to encounters with friends and/or family. To replace certain worn out, boring and monotonous activities, that our "creature of habit" makes us generate.

*To know. To listen. To talk. To teach. To learn. To move. To defy (oneself). To tie. To change. To untie. To consolidate. To discuss. To question. To laugh. To reformulate. To bring to a conclusion. To enjoy. To grow. To rest.*

In this letter you will find a kind of recommendations summary. We hope they will help you implement this idea (if you find it interesting). Many of us had this idea before, there is nothing new to it, but we needed a little push to put it into practice. It becomes necessary to point out that this set of recommendations is the result of observations in real sessions and made things work in a more positive way. Each group will have its own needs and this letter should be considered just as a guide, a flexible one as this project is also **flexible**. When reading it, you will notice that it strongly emphasizes certain recommendations i.e. we will insist in the idea that "this letter only provides recommendations and not rules".

*We hope that we can pass on how important and necessary we feel this initiative is.*

### *Explaining the Knowledge Journey*

*You received this letter* because the person who sent it to you considers that, in addition to being a person open to new social experiences, you will be able to share certain topics that you master and, probably, you will contribute in creating a new Club Root. The criteria chain to send this letter is the core to the project, but we are all equally necessary for it to work. From now on, we will call participants "travelers".

You are not more special than the others for having received the letter, for each one will contribute with their experience in The Knowledge Journey.

Modes and customs from different Roots participating in the Project (from different parts of the world) are summarized. In this way, we try to guide the facilitator so that all questions<sup>2</sup> are cleared but yet freedom of choice stays.

We know that most groups —or “Roots”— meet on Saturday or Sunday afternoons —because that’s a time in the week when everyone is at ease. Generally, sessions take place every two or three weeks. However some groups decided to meet on week days in the evening and it also worked. In that case, meetings were shorter —and in some cases more frequent.

Roots are generally formed by groups of no more than 15 to 20 people. It has been shown that when there are more members, they start to divert from the group’s general interest. There is no minimum required. We learnt that a Root with 4 travelers worked fine.

Each Knowledge Journey --that is the way the sessions will be called-- consists of 1, 2, or 3 classes offered by the travelers. Each class is taught by a different traveler. What generally happens is that each Root ends up being formed by a group of acquaintances (probably friends, relatives, work mates, etc). And, sometimes, acquaintance’s acquaintances. In a way, that is the goal: to be in a friendly, comfortable and relaxed environment.

*If you received this letter and you haven’t participated:*

The traveler receiving this letter is normally in charge of putting a schedule together. In this schedule, each traveler’s classes will be arranged, trying that each session counts with 1, 2, or 3 totally different topics. Later on, there is a Root sample schedule and the invitation e-mails of another Root. It is not really important if topics are organized/chosen for the whole set of sessions (if there is an end). It is important that the topics for the next or the next two sessions are chosen.

The Sessions should be organized in such a way that there is a variety of topics. It doesn’t really matter if the traveler giving the lesson doesn’t have teaching experience. There is always a first time. In addition, the idea is that he or she doesn’t look like a teacher, but instead, that he or she looks like a traveler sharing their experiences with other travelers who will be their peers during the Sessions. Each class should last 1.30 hours at the most—it has been observed that if they last longer, participants start to divert-- . In this way, each meeting or “Session” should not be longer than 5 hours. It all depends on the kind of travelers. Some do pretty intensive classes and others do shorter and more general ones. A balance is struck after a few sessions.

Part 1

*Recommendations for the organizing traveler, based on experiences of previous roots:*

1. The recipient of this letter will keep the record of all the information since the initiation of the new Root.
2. If you agree to it, write to BOTH e-mail addresses at the heading of this letter<sup>3</sup>, sending the following information:
  - Nickname
  - Country
  - City
  - Age

As you can see, personal details are not required. The e-mail address enables future meetings between Local Roots and International ones. If you don't want to send your details, don't do it. Nobody will benefit from having them, but, instead, it would enable you and your group to create bonds in the future.

- 3 The organizing traveler (or facilitator) will call other travelers willing to share information and have a good time. It is important to point out that this is not only about a meeting among friends. Personal criteria are vital to forming groups and inviting the people who will, for sure, enjoy the activity. In this way, minimum group continuity will be assured. There are many stories in which facilitators come across people who ask: "what's the point in having lessons on Sundays?" Each facilitator will know better about how to write the invitation according to his or her environment (this letter should not be considered an invitation, as it suggests just an idea not suitable for your party of friends).

- 4 **All travelers must teach something and only people willing to share their knowledge will be admitted.** This recommendation should be followed so that the Sessions work in a just way. **This is one of the few pillars of the Project.** We all have something to teach, though little interesting, or small it may seem. It seems clear that many people will feel tempted to attend the lessons just as a listener, but if that were the case, there wouldn't be any interchange. There are no hired teachers in this project. We are the teachers, the learners too. We will not be paid

for doing this. Remember that this activity is about information and personal experience exchange. It is not indispensable that all people invited know what topics will they develop; they only have to be committed to do it some time. We all have something to teach or share, though meaningless it may seem. From one's perspective, all the knowledge we have seems less complex than it would really be for a person who has never heard nothing about it. All we know is the result of previous experiences and happenings, including personal criteria, and conclusion and observation formation. We were briefed about a "traveler" who used to work at the customer service department in a medical insurance company in a certain country. The truth is that she knew better than anybody else the way in which this system works. She thought she had nothing to contribute within the Sessions, but it turned out that she ended up giving a great class on this topic.

- 5 Offering a pleasant talk on a certain topic does not mean teaching a master class at university. It's just about a talk among friends. Some will find it harder than others –because they don't have any experience or because they have to teach more complex topics—it's true. But those who feel comfortable teaching will have to get used to being listeners again, and that is also difficult.

**We aim at training both listeners and speakers equally**

**Listeners should remember that:**

- We don't know everything in life
- There isn't a productive end to everything
- Some moments and ways are more suitable when asking a question
- No question is stupid
- There is always someone who can contribute with information about a certain topic. That doesn't mean that we are ignorant.
- Nobody is born knowing everything
- Nobody is born knowing how to teach and imbue knowledge.
- Other people and topics can surprise us.

**Speakers should remember that:**

- We don't know everything in life
- There isn't a productive end to everything

- Some moments and ways are more suitable when asking a question
  - No question is stupid
  - There is always a person we can contribute with a certain topic. That doesn't mean that we are wise.
  - Nobody is born knowing everything
  - Nobody is born knowing how to admit that they have doubts
  - It's a good idea to foster interest and participation regardless the topic being discussed (that skill should be exercised by teachers and professors in all kinds of institutions).
  - They should become aware on how to pass on ideas; always bearing in mind the explanation those listeners (or each listener) needs in order to understand it.
- 6 The number of invited people will be decided by the recipient of this letter. Depending, for instance, on the space you have.
  - 7 We will call "Root" the group of travelers invited by each recipient of this letter.
  - 8 We will try NOT to invite someone because of the specific topic they might share, but because of the simple reason of sharing something with that person. "Do not invite because of what is known but because of the readiness and willingness of such person to share new experiences."
  - 9 The facilitator should present the first topic in the first Session, to be in charge of the first Session. To take the first step. The most difficult one. To start the opening Session of the Knowledge Journey. If there were more lessons that day, it would be convenient for the other travelers to present different kinds of classes. One very different from the other. Remember that no one will know for sure what the objective of such meetings is. Many years have passed, and we haven't been able to summarize the objectives in "10 simple and spontaneous sentences." What we do know is that we keep doing it because we enjoy it. The difference lies in the fact that now we know more people, we got to know better the people we already knew, and we know more about a lot more topics.
  - 10 If possible, it is convenient to get a board, a computer, a projector (borrowed or rented) to project Power Point presentations, to show videos and films, and to write ideas down and whatever it takes to create a fluid exchange. It is also convenient to count with a home audio system (for films, music, etc). If that is not the case, photocopies and borrowed audio equipment can be used to carry out some classes.

- 11 As far as it is possible, drug use or excessive use of liquor of any kind before and during the Session should be avoided. Those would make travelers divert very easily. That would entail a negative attitude towards the traveler who is presenting a topic, for some listeners wouldn't be paying attention. That was observed in practice.
- 12 A traveler can be part of only one Root at a time (as his or her Root will meet with another one which is different and unknown if the 2nd part of the Project is implemented).
- 13 Classes will last 1.30 hours at most (so that each Session lasts up to 4 or 5 hours).
- 14 A traveler can only teach one class per Session (so that in one day, 2 or 3 different travelers have the opportunity to share different topics). **If one traveler has more than one topic to share –what is very likely--, he or she will have to share them on another set date once the first round of lessons is over. In the first round everybody shares a topic.**
- 15 **LESSONS ARE SURPRISE. The topics to be discussed in each session are to be known by the facilitator and the travelers presenting topics that day only. The travelers teaching that day should not know what other travelers will be sharing with them. And it's the facilitator's responsibility not to disclose the schedule. This is another pillar of the Sessions. The surprise factor.** Most probably, that will bring about some questioning at first, and the facilitator will unavoidably become the protagonist, what is not desirable. However, once the Sessions have started, the surprise factor will become part of the undeniable essence of this Journey. By doing this, we aim at **MAKING ALL TRAVELLERS ATTEND THE SESSIONS NOT BECAUSE THEY WANT TO LEARN ABOUT A SPECIFIC TOPIC, BUT FOR THE DIVERSITY OF TOPICS. ATTENDANCE SHOULD BE PREJUDICE-FREE.** We insist: we know that participants may resist this at first, but it is vital for the working of the Sessions. This project shouldn't be a training institute or school, where people can choose courses on the topics they are interested in; thinking which one will be useful for them and which not. Many times, we judge the topic or the person in advance without knowing what it is about. Listeners should not only be the beneficiaries. Speakers should benefit from the fact of being listened to –not caring if most of them are interested in the topic or not--. And remember: we are the listeners and the speakers too! Also, it is the responsibility of the person receiving this letter to guide an inexperienced speaker –even when the organizer does not have the experience— to channel the class and make it as interesting as possible. However, he or she should not censure the speaker. That would be a wrong mistake. This Project is **FREE**.
- 16 Find a place where the travelers can meet. If possible, it should be comfortable and known by all travelers. For example the house of one of the travelers, a courtyard, garden, terrace, etc. If that is not possible, a small rented function room could work. Costs are discussed later on in this letter. It is not necessary to point

- out that the meeting place can change conveniently (although fixing a place makes organization easier and makes that environment a comfortable and known place to participants).
- 17 Once the group has been formed and after a few Sessions, it is not advisable to add or rotate people (although there are always some absentees in each meeting). In practice, we observed that this brings about confusion to schedule organization. Adding more people means not creating a second round of lessons, (that's for people who teach more than one lesson). Moreover, the newcomer will have to make an effort to become a member in an already existing group and learn about codes, which creates asymmetry. Remember that it would be better if the people who want to join the Project –but who are not members of the initial group--created a new group to interact then with the initial group. There have been cases in which people learn about the Project and want to join it once the group has shared some sessions. Ideally, communication among them should be enabled although maybe they don't know each other –which is highly probable— so that they form a new group. In this way, such activity can be enriched time and again. It is not necessary to clarify that invited travelers can invite other people as long as they pass on the pillars of this Project and group number is not exceeded to avoid confusion from the organization standpoint.
  - 18 Bear in mind that classes can be not only theoretical but also practical. (Example: yoga, theater, painting, martial arts lesson, etc) For that reason, the physical place must suit the class to be developed. We have observed that a Session combining both theory and practical lessons is more enjoyable.
  - 19 E-mail addresses of people invited should be gathered to previously inform if a certain element is necessary for the upcoming session (notebook, pencil, music, comfortable clothes, etc)
  - 20 If there are no chairs for everyone, each participant can bring a small mattress, pillow or cushion.
  - 21 We suggest that a variety of food and drinks is served, depending on the meeting time, to rest between one lesson and the other and keep discussing the topics developed or just to relax and stop thinking. Some rest, just that.
  - 22 Expenses will be equally divided by the number of people in the group, trying to estimate them before each Session and letting other people know if the group needs to incur in extra expenses. This activity should not bring about financial problems. We know that money can bring about confusion (such thing happens in our society and although during the Sessions we try to put prejudices aside, money is always an issue). It's advisable to solve that problem once the Session is over.
  - 23 After each Session, all travelers will clean up and order the meeting place.
  - 24 If a digital film recorder is available, talks could be registered and shared with other groups in the future.

## Recommending the Project

If you start the Project, it means you agree with it. That means that you might want to recommend it to other people, if it results in a positive experience (whatever you think the word “positive” means). To do so, it is important that you follow these pieces of advice, as far as possible:

1. Our philosophy is that this letter should not be available in the internet, at least at the first stage. It should be given person to person or sent by traditional mail. E-mail chains are massive, and for that reason they unfortunately end up bringing about the opposite effect: we delete them before reading them (judging its contents in advance). So as not to swim against the tide, we thought it to be special to go back to traditional mailing. We are so used to e-mails, that for some—probably— sending this letter via traditional mail or meeting people to give it to them personally might be nuisance. Most probably, some people will learn how to send letters via mail when sending this one. They will then realize that it is not a big deal. So, photocopy this letter when willing to send it (keep a copy for you).
2. Make sure you make double-sided photocopies. In this way you will use fewer sheets of paper and you will indirectly be contributing with the environment.
3. Send this letter as many times as necessary.
4. If you need to translate this letter into any other language, send your request to the e-mail addresses heading this letter. It is being translated into the most spoken languages (this is a slow process, so that ideas are transmitted correctly).
5. **Take a picture of each traveler when teaching their class in order to keep a record.**
6. Send this letter in a sealed envelope including:
  - Sender and Address
  - A photocopy of this letter (keep the one you received)
  - A handwritten letter for the address, telling him or her that you are carrying this Project out --either as a facilitator or participant—, or that you did it in the past. State if you organized it or you were invited.
  - Attach YOUR photo when you were teaching a class --and if you want to, attach pictures taken during the sessions-- that will finally prove that this project can be put into practice. Seeing is believing. It is not necessary that you include color or high definition pictures. What matters is to show that this is REAL. This is not about trust. A friend wouldn't need a picture to believe you. However, we heard good comments from people who started because the photos showed the traveler's enthusiasm.

7. Try to give this letter to the people who stayed out of your Root as soon as possible. Probably, the reason they stayed out was because they didn't have enough time, or space, or because they live in a different city. You should always send your picture, and that will invariably be after offering your first class (if you are a facilitator, you will be the first to present).
8. If you are a facilitator in a new Root: as every traveler in your group presents a topic, give them this letter together with their picture. It is not necessary to give the people in your Root a handwritten letter, as they know all the details. In this way, if the travelers in your group find these meetings a positive experience, they will be able to recommend it to their beloved ones.

## **Part 2 Creating Bonds**

Interaction among Roots will take place once each Root has dealt with all its topics –as many rounds as they want--. **DO NOT RUSH INTO THE SECOND STAGE OF THE PROJECT. YOU HAVE TO SENSE THAT THE FIRST STAGE IS OVER.** At that moment, you will be able to interact with other Roots and share new topics –and form “Trees”--. To take this step forward in the Sessions, ask for contact with other roots to the e-mail addresses heading this letter. When the website is finished, that won't be necessary given that there won't be intermediaries. Meetings among Roots are very interesting because there are people from different walks of life, but with highly important common traits... more than you can imagine. Will we be able to give birth to something bigger by joining all the Roots?

### **How does it help if I send my personal details?**

As above mentioned, your group will be enriched, as long as you believe so. You will be able to contact other Roots and you will be able to request some recommendations via e-mail. Remember that the people who created this project may not give a satisfying response. This activity is mainly about the travelers' criteria.

But there is something to point out: if you register, you will receive news from the worldwide project, new tips, and new activities to do in your group (in addition to the classic classes). Also travelers can suggest activities, point out observations, etc.

**This is the invitation that someone who received this letter sent to his people:**

(Thank you Dario for your contribution)

A friend of mine –Pablo, the guy from the trip— sent me a letter suggesting a very wacky but good idea that he is carrying out there –he also got the letter from a friend--. I like that idea so I'm going to propose it to you. I have to invite friends who I think might get on board, and that's why I'm sending it to you. If you help me, we will implement it. This Project is called "The Knowledge Journey."

We can meet in the backyard of my folks' house on Saturdays or Sundays and the whole thing is about teaching something and also being the students. According to this letter, one to three lessons are taught so that sessions are not too short and not too heavy. We can do it every 2 weeks, but maybe we could do it every 3. We can start with 2 lessons. If we split expenses, we can prepare a BBQ, at least the first time. Or if we meet in the afternoons we can have some mates. I know it's weird, but it could be fun. Classes can be about anything, as long as our objective is to share knowledge and have a good time. There are some tips to make organization easier. There are some things that I don't find convincing, but we can adjust it to suit our needs. Diego can bring his board and Mariana, her projector (if you like the idea...)

Apparently, this letter is circulating in many countries and a network of people who participated is being formed. In Spain, for instance, some guys (Pablo's group) taught about Franco, some Japanese, music, and some other good stuff. Thinking about you guys, I know you have something

to say, and those who can't think of anything right now, I know you will find something sooner or later.

I think it's pretty cool and it can be a lot of fun. What's more, we have been meeting in the same bar lately and we always end up doing the same thing. I am tired of that. I already said so.

I have already started organizing it because I know some of you will agree to it. Start suggesting topics. Ah! One thing: classes must be surprise (I like this idea mentioned in the letter because it increases anxiety). What's more, classes are not meant to be chosen, because maybe some of us won't have any students and that is not nice –a bit funny, though--. And the last idea is that EVERYONE WILL HAVE TO TEACH AT SOME GIVEN TIME. Otherwise, all of us will be listeners and no one will be a speaker! I already made a list of the things you might want to share. Then I will send you another mail with some more ideas.

### **The Road Taken**


As above mentioned, this a NON PROFIT PROJECT. It would be very easy to turn this into a business, but part of its essence would be ruined. We hope that nobody benefits from this project financially-wise (we've never benefited from it).

Another issue is organization: why not adding more people once the Root has been formed and in that way enlarge it? The answer is pretty simple: a natural pattern in our society is expansion (concentric organization), being the more experienced or older members at its heart (applied to the Sessions). To enlarge groups is tempting; making some organizers/Roots obviously more successful (any business person would do that when running their businesses). These Sessions are not like businesses companies. They are the opposite. It would be impossible for a newcomer to be at the same level as the rest in an already formed root, even being well intentioned.

We know the world isn't the way we want it to be. And, every now and then, that makes us think the way to act more naturally according to this world and we go exactly the other way about (not out of rebelliousness, but of hope).


To avoid that way of organizing the Sessions, we put forward the network topology that joins small autonomous "Roots". Micro societies, in which the facilitator in each Root does not have an increasingly prominent role (they just have to coordinate no more than 20 people, always consulting on new decisions). And each Root is a new form of life. This enables roots meeting one with the other and interchange can go in different directions, but always at the same level. No asymmetries. No prominence. In concentric organizations there is always asymmetry between the center and the newer layers.

**Concentric:**



More natural organization stemming from our current society. We all know that it doesn't bring about good results (there is a growing asymmetry between the center and the outer layer). Rules are made in the nucleus, while new members join an already formed group. This is against some observations in practice: the more the group consolidates itself, the more possibilities to explore new committing activities exist. That would be impossible if the group is continuously modified. "Would you talk about your fears or deep doubts with a perfect stranger?"

**Network:**




Network organization put forward by these Sessions where there is no prominence (but for the facilitator who has a few tasks to do). Newcomers form a new Root and relate to the others at the same level. This makes the spirit in this project to be constantly renewed and doesn't force newcomers to understand an already started project. It's always back to square one, with new ideas and experiences.

Just until the website is up and running, the network is formed through received information exchange sent to the e-mail addresses heading this letter. Then it will work autonomously.
